Councilman Brent Jaramillo was very complimentary regarding the presentations and asked if the Red River would ever be considered an outstanding water or not - because of the damages caused by the mine sight. Mr. Roper acknowledged that it would depend on the existing water quality in the Red River, he is not familiar with the current metric impairments, so it would depend on that. He stated that in the future it is possible if there are not existing impairments, but it would take clean up and improvement of water quality to designate it as an outstanding water. Ms. Navas also answered that from a recreational standpoint the Red River would be a clear and real priority for an outstanding water. Councilman Jaramillo asked if the work of towards improving the water quality and fishery that has been done in the past, could be considered because of the mine site. Or could specific portions that have been worked on be considered? Mr. Roper said it is something he can look into and can be considered.

Councilor Jaramillo asked Ms. Navas if her department has considered asking Governor's office about transferring the trails money that NMDOT has over to her division. Ms. Navas stated that those conversations have been had and they will continue to have them.

Mr. Roper asked that if Trout Unlimited was going to pursue a designation on the Rio Grande, would the Mayor and Council consider supporting the designation and asked how they would do so? Mayor stated that the Village could support but did not go into detail on how that partnership would take place.

Mr. DeFillippo presented information regarding the Moratorium that will allow for a hold to be put on for certain construction in variance applications, this only applies to specific aspects of the Village due to the fact that there's only a number of districts that can be affected at a single time. He stated that this specific ordinance will affect all construction and variance applications regarding business districts, residential will not be affected, however, Mr. DeFillippo explained that the business district, agricultural recreational open space district, the general and hwy servicing district, light industrial district and the heavy industrial district as stated in the Moratorium under Section 2 -those districts are described within the zoning ordinance and are currently placed on the zoning map that are specifically stated in the attachment. In essence this Moratorium will put a hold on any construction and variance applications for a period of six months, this will allow the Village to update the Planning and Zoning ordinance and the Village Comprehensive Plan.

Councilwoman Louise Gallegos commended Mr. DeFillippo on his detailed work provided to this Moratorium. Councilman John Anthony Ortega had a question regarding the continued and future development of the Business Park. Mr. DeFillippo stated that there are some exclusions and exceptions to the Moratorium referenced in Section 4. These exclusions and exceptions will allow work to continue with any projects that are Village controlled applications. Councilman Charlie Gonzales asked about the affects of the Agricultural properties when requesting to put a house on the property. Mr. DeFillippo explains that the Moratorium does affect the Agricultural districts.
