Ms. Martinez read aloud the public comments that were submitted to her by email regarding the proposed Dollar General. They are part of the record and are referenced as Attachment 'A' to these minutes.

Christian Isely, Chevron – Stated that Chevron has assisted in terms of the Covid 19 pandemic response. They have given \$10,000.00 to the North Central Food Pantry in Questa as well as \$5,000.00 to the Taos Feeds Taos recognizing the significant economic impact during the pandemic. In addition, 125 face shields were provided Holy Cross Hospital as well as to Questa EMS. Mr. Isely stated that he was glad to see that the Village would like to work with grant writer Terry Brunner for the La Cienega project. He recommended that the Village work with Mr. Brunner in obtaining much needed grants that are currently available.

Mr. Joseph Karnes of Summer, Karnes & Associates stated that he is present tonight on behalf of the applicant 12 Oaks Development. He stated that the principals of 12 Oaks are also present – Mr. Jerrold Pedigo and Mr. Drew Crosby. Mr. Karnes expressed his appreciation for the Council's efforts and willingness to set up this meeting remotely as his wife has a disability and he is not in a position where he can travel to attend public meetings. He stated that they appreciate the opportunity to present and look forward to receiving a decision on this application this evening. They are requesting an application for a permitted use as defined by the Village of Questa zoning ordinance that designates this property for retail use. This was a decision that was made by this council in a previous meeting when the zoning ordinance was adopted along with the zoning map designating this property for residential use and critically, the decision was made to allow that use to occur subject to compliance with the development standards set forth in the zoning ordinance. There has been a lot of discussion about whether or not this retail should happen on this property. This use is as of right as defined by your zoning ordinance; it is not a conditional use - if it was, his clients wouldn't have come to the Village of Questa. He stated that they are not here to persuade the Council that they should allow this use to occur; the zoning ordinance has already declared that this is a permitted use and there is no discretion in making this decision. He stated that the Council is not here to exercise their discretion on this application and it's important to keep that in mind because by designating retail use as a permitted use on this property the Village has created a property right that has been recognized by the New Mexico Supreme Court in the case of Albuquerque Commons versus the City of Albuquerque. 12 Oaks has acted in reliance on the representations made in the Village's Zoning Ordinance. He stated that they have already sued the Village of Questa and briefly discussed the reason. He stated that 12 Oaks came to the Village in October and applied for this permitted use; in November the Village came back and requested a permit from the New Mexico Department of Transportation for the permission to go out onto the state highway. Typically, that type of ministerial permit is obtained after the local decision is obtained as a sequential process, it is a ministerial process and NMDOT does not exercise discretion; if you meet their standards, they issue the permit. The zoning ordinance doesn't require this, but his

clients realize they need to get that permit anyway, so they decided to apply for it. It took some time to get that permit. About that time, COVID-19 hit. We understand that that has turned the world upside down for all of us; that is not why we sued the Village. We understand that and appreciate the efforts that have been made to consider this application; however, on April 7th he received a letter from the Village Counsel raising a new issue pointing at state statue having to do with issuance of business licenses and making the representation that indeed the Village does have the discretion to decide whether or not this particular retail use is appropriate for this particular piece of property. He sent a detailed letter in response and the key is that nasty statue was never brought up in the six months between October and April. This was an issue that could have been brought up immediately. It is not in the Zoning Ordinance; after we surmounted the hurdle of the New Mexico Department of Transportation we found ourselves facing yet another hurdle that had not been brought up before. He stated that we are not here to play games and that is why we demanded to be heard and eventually filed suit to compel a decision in this case; a decision that again is non-discretionary. We have met all the standards and the approval is required to be granted.

Mr. Karnes stated that for the record, speaking of economic issues, he understands by reading the Albuquerque Journal and also the Taos News, that Mayor Gallegos is the operator of the El Monte Carlo Lounge and has represented to my clients in the past that this retail use being proposed by 12 Oaks may have a harmful effect on his and other retail businesses in the area. He stated that if we are going to court and continue with the ongoing litigation, this is a factor that I think the judge will be interested in. He stated that in his 25 years of experience, that's called a conflict of interest. This is why we have sued the Village. We have a hearing scheduled for next week before Judge Chavez. He stated that they are asking for a YES decision tonight on the action item; if so, his clients are willing to drop their lawsuit and not pursue any damages and move forward with their project; they did not come to have a fight with the Village; they came here because of what the zoning ordinance says they can do as a matter of right; however if the vote is NO tonight, they will continue on with the litigation. He stated that they would rather build a store that will benefit this community than fight with the Village. If they have to continue litigating, there are some things he needs to point out: This affects both the Village in his client. Whenever litigation takes place it is time consuming, it's in-efficient and it's expensive. Both parties will be spending money on lawyers. The most effective thing to do is to implement and apply the zoning ordinance as it is written. Lawyers will be paid during the length of the litigation however long that it takes. The other issue is risk - when you submit a dispute to a judge neither party knows how it is going to turn out-that's the judge's decision at the end of the process. After all that money is spent on the litigation. We will be pursuing damages against the Village; we'd rather not do this, but we are placed between a rock and a hard place.

 Mayor Gallegos stated that this is a really nice presentation of how the Dollar General wants to come into Questa; by telling us about all the legal consequences that we already understand. We have legal counsel. This is not helping how you are trying to propose how great a Dollar General is going to come forth to the Village of Questa, I just wanted to say that for the record. I hope you can wrap up your presentation I do not see how this is showing how much benefit the Dollar General will be to Questa. He stated that he did learn a lot of legal content that will help me down the road.

Mr. Karnes thanked Mayor Gallegos and stated that this is the Village's Zoning Ordinance; we are playing by your rules. Your rules state that retail use on this property is permitted. He stated he will be available to answer any questions and turned it over to Mr. Pedigo.

Mr. Pedigo thanked the Mayor and Council for the opportunity to address them and express once again their desire to be a developer, owner, and neighbor in the Village of Questa. He stated that they began this process by researching your Village and identifying it as a possible location for a new Dollar General store. Dollar General quickly realized it was a community they wanted to be in and a place that they could be successful by providing variety and competition to the benefit of the residents in the Village and the general area. They then, began the process of searching for a site for this new store. He stated that when they go into any town or village

and look for a new site, they make every effort to secure a piece of property that has already been identified as a place that the local leaders have already zone for the intended use that the new Dollar General would require. They do this for a combination of reasons. One reason is that they don't want to try and tell the Village or its residents where they should allow this type of retail; instead they want to go where the Village and the residents have already decided where they want commercial properties located and in particular this type of retail. They secured a piece of property that the Village had already identified in zone for their particular use. He stated that they understand that there seldom will ever be zero opposition to any proposal. There has been opposition to our proposed store. Not everyone supports our plans or Dollar General store in the Village of Questa. All we ask is to be treated fairly and equitably according to your own study through codes, policies, and procedures. Additionally, this lack of proceeding and allowing the project to continue is financially impacting the woman that has been your property neighbor for years and who has owned the property for years, who has paid taxes. Miss Elsie Piper is an elderly lady who has had high hopes to get the property sold and use the proceeds to help her ailing husband, who has died during this process and as a result never was able to use the proceeds for his medical needs. He is asking that the Council follow the rules, policies and zoning codes and administer them fairly. Mr. Pedigo thanked the Mayor and Council for their time and concluded his presentation.
