IX. FINANCIALS - Ms. Karen Shannon, Finance Director

A) Discussion, Consideration & Decision -Resolution No. 2021-21 / FY 2021 Final Quarter Financial Report Resolution

Ms. Shannon gave a brief update regarding the QEDF board meeting in which she did a presentation to the board on behalf of the Village of Questa for funding that the Village has been requesting. She informed the Council that the funding that was requested has been granted to the Village.

There were also conversations regarding if this board would be paid for their placement on the board. This will continue to be talked about in the next few weeks.

X. MATTERS FROM ATTORNEY – Mr. Chris DeFillippo, Robles, Rael & Anaya

A) Cannabis Ordinance

Mr. DeFillippo has come to the Mayor and Council to ask their ideas of how they anticipate seeing the growth, sale and use of Marijuana being handled in Questa as it complies with state statute. This information will help him to create a proper Cannabis Ordinance for the Village. He also stated that he has draft ordinances from different areas with different interpretations that he could provide. He is encouraging an ordinance to be drafted due to date sensitive deadlines. Councilman Jaramillo shared information regarding how the County will be permitting and prohibiting it within the County limits. Councilman Gonzales had a concern with the enforcement of the ordinance and how much that will cost the Village? Mr. DeFillippo could not answer what the additional cost for enforcement would be, being that this is a new ordinance.

B) Draft RV Ordinance

Mr. DeFillippo is still in need of guidance to finalize this draft. He has tightened it up to limit it to very specific use of the agreement for the RV users that are working on behalf of the Chevron Mining Inc. contractors coming in for work purposes only. Mayor Gallegos is also asking that the Council consider utility fee increases to those homeowners that are providing the space to these RVer's. There was much conversation throughout from all regarding several topics and concerns that could connect to this type of RV space rental ordinance.

C) Water Rights from Chevron

Mr. DeFillippo stated that per the conversations he has had with Mr. Isely the Chevron Representative, the water rights application, to help the Village with water diversion is currently sitting at the Office of the State Engineer and is under review they do not anticipate having an answer regarding this for the next four weeks or so.

XI. MATTERS FROM ADMINISTRATION- Ms. Renee Martinez, CMC /Interim Administrator Ms. Martinez was not present. Project update provided.

XII. MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBERS

- Mayor Gallegos shared that the QEDF would like to have a retreat to include the Village. Per Ms. Lynn Skall's suggestion a work study is necessary to sit down and have conversations to make sure everyone is on board and on the same page. Mayor asked that everyone review the August calendar and try to lock in a date to have the work study and retreat.
- Councilman Ortega gave an update to Vida Del Norte's upcoming events to be held on July 31 and August 21st.
