VII. DISCUSSION ITEMS

 A) FY 2023 America Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Expenditures, Mrs. Quintana Shannon presented some recommendations for the ARPA Expenditures for FY 2023. She included the ARPA list in the council packet that was presented in the previous regular Council Meeting. Mrs. Quintana Shannon went over the expenditures again to further explain the list. Changes and recommendations are as follows.

- Councilor Gonzalez recommended Vida Del Norte Coalition get an additional \$5,000 from last year for a total of \$10,000
- Karen Quintana Shannon recommended money allocation for a security fence for the Village of Questa to ensure Village property is not stolen or gas taken from VOQ vehicles.
- Mayor Ortega recommended \$2,000 to CAV
- Mayor Ortega recommended \$2,500 Non-Violence Works

Final decision and approval of ARPA will be held at the next Regular Council Meeting

VIII. ACTION ITEMS

 A) Discussion, Consideration, & Decision- Command Vehicle for EMS Director/Deputy Fire Chief Valerie Vigil, CPO presented to the Council the need and cost for a new vehicle for Raynelle Sanchez-Cordova who is the EMS Director and Deputy Fire Chief for the Village of Questa. Quotes and proposals were submitted within the packets of the Council for them to look over prior to the Council meeting. It was recommended to the Council for Mrs. Cordova to obtain a 2023 Tahoe outfitted for the amount of \$43,796.00 not including decals and outfitting. The funding will be coming out of General Fund Majority Voted Yes, Motion Carried

IX. STAFF REPORTS

A) Chief Montez reported to the Council the progress that is being made in the Police Station to ensure that it is being properly equipped and follows all regulations and guidelines before Chief can begin patrolling the streets of Questa. His unit will be outfitted within the next 2 months, some equipment has been ordered

such as body cams, patches, some uniform items, etc. There have been some interest in applicants applying for the Police Officer Position. Councilwoman Gonzales asked about the need for Certified Officers and if non-Certified would be ok, Chief Montez did state at this time he would like to hire Certified Police officers to ensure that the Police Station get started within a reasonable amount of time, instead of hiring and sending out applicants to the Academy. Chief Montez has also been working on updating the Policy Manuel as it is the same since 1997. He is working diligently and is looking forward to patrolling in the near future; no date set at this time

B) Jacob LaFore reported to the Council the updates on the Red River Restoration Project. Boots were in the water September 20, 2022 and began south of bridge at the intersection of South Kiowa and Old red River Road. The Project is so far doing great and great progress has been made. Mr. LaFore shared some photos and explained to the Council and attending members of the meeting to show different areas of the project and its progression.

C) Valerie Vigil, Village Clerk reported to the Council the new grant award for a VISTA Volunteer to help with economic projects for the Village of Questa. She stated the Village is currently in the recruiting process and will update once a VISTA is hired. Mrs. Vigil also presented on upcoming events for the Village including the participation in the Homecoming Parade as well as an update on the Trunk o Treat. Mrs. Vigil stated there are about 21 "Trunks" that will be participating in the event. The event will be held on October 28th from 2-4 pm at the Business Park

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XII. MATTERS FROM THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBERS

Mayor Ortega asked Mrs. Quintana Shannon to present on the need for a new Village Vehicle for Staff. The current Village car is standard and not all Village Personnel can drive the vehicle. The car is also getting old and used and needs to be replaced. Councilor Jason Gonzalez stated the NM Flag in the middle of town is getting worn out and needs to be replaced. Councilor Katrina Gonzalez asked about needing more police support on Lama Road and presented on the concerns the Head Start and Ancianos are facing having to share the same kitchen. It was recommended that the Village look into the VFW and see where the status of restoration is on the kitchen remodel. Mayor Ortega updated on Taos Bakes and the desire of the Company for more space. The option for Taos Bakes to use the La Cienega Gym for storage throughout the winter is on the table to discuss. The Council discussed for Taos Bakes to use it temporary but not permanently.
